Heritage Room showcases the growth and development of the college since 1973. It comprises of pictures of successive Presidents, General Secretaries, Principals, meritorious students and other memorable pictures of important events of the college. A picture of our worthy Director Dr. (Mrs) Varinder Gandhi, an alumnus of this college receiving 'Academic Excellence Award' also adorns the walls of this room.

Mentor-Mentee

Twenty to thirty students are put in a group under one teacher which is called a Mentor-Mentee group. The teacher-in-charge guides and mentors students for all kinds of academic or personal problems.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The cell has been constituted to solve the problems of the students. Their day to day problems regarding hostel, mess, canteen, bus, university and college results etc. are addressed by the members of the cell.

Equal Opportunity Centre

The centre has been opened in the college to see the effective implementation of the policies and programmes for students belonging to disadvantaged sections of the society. It also provides them counselling in their academic, personal and social matters.

SC/BC/Minority Cell

This cell has been constituted to ensure effective implementation of different scholarship schemes being awarded to SC/BC students. The cell also takes care of the general welfare of these students.

Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC & Minorities

Remedial coaching is granted at undergraduate and Postgraduate level with a view to improve academic skills and linguistic proficiency of the students. Their knowledge and comprehension level of basic subjects is improved to give them a stronger foundation for further academic work. In subjects involving laboratory work, the skill and attitude of the students is strengthened so that they come up to the level necessary for pursuing higher studies efficiently.

Network Resource Centre

The objective of the centre is to create awareness among staff and students about the use of computers and to provide them an access to Internet for teaching and learning.

Day Care Centre

To help the women and working parents to pursue their career without having to worry about their children during working hours. A secure and loving environment is provided in the Day Care Centre.

Preparatory Classes for NET and other competitive exams

The college provides special coaching for NET, Civil Services & other competitive exams to the aspirant students.

Library

The college library has become one of the few libraries of the state of Haryana by getting RFID library system installed. The library is fully air-conditioned with open shelf system. It has more than 68276 volume of books; 58 journals, 18 newspapers and 2421 thesis and project reports. Our library is well furnished and completely computerised. It has a database of all the books, journals, magazines and newspapers. The books are barcoded. Internet and Photostat facility is also available in the library. The interested students and staff members are given access to e-resources, through INFLIBNET via registration through library. The e-library comprises of 1044 CDs of books, 40,000 online journals and 3,15,000 online books. The library has as an Online Public Access Catalogue system.

The library is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

'Earn While You Learn' Scheme

Needy students are employed by the college in Laboratories/Library/Office under 'Earn While You Learn' scheme (A scheme to provide part time campus employment to the students of college). The scheme was started by the college during 2001-2002 as per direction of the H.E.C. Haryana, Chandigarh. Meritorious and needy students are employed on part time jobs in library/office/laboratory for which they are paid an honorarium of Rs. 30/- per period in lieu of their service rendered to the college.

Divinity (Spiritual and Moral Education)

Its objective is to impart the comparative knowledge of different religions and to inculcate high spiritual and moral values in the delicate minds and souls of young students. It is beneficial for creating harmony and secularism in the society and the nation. There is a separate wing of Divinity in the college library in which the books of different religions are available. Sukhmani Sahib Path & Gurbani Kirtan is performed to mark the beginning of the session and Akhand Path is performed at the end of the session every year. Training in Shabad-Kirtan is imparted to the talented students by the Music Department. State level Shabad Gayan Competition and Shudh Gurubani Ucharan contests are also held. Guru Ram Das Gurpurab is celebrated every year in which the whole town is invited. Sewa of Sehaj Path and preparation of Langar is done by the students and the

staff of the college. Essay writing competition on "Life and Teachings of Sri Guru Ram Das Ji" is also held on the occasion.

College Bus Service/Transportation

College is plying 8 buses in rural areas within the radius of 50 kms on very economical rates. Apart from that students are also issued Haryana Roadways bus passes on quarterly and yearly basis. Railway concession passes are also issued. To provide security to bus commuters, CCTV cameras with GPS system have been installed in all the college buses.

Women Study Cell / Legal Literacy Cell

Women study cell/Legal Literary Cell has been established in the college under National Policy of Education. These cells are established with the aim to empower women in their struggle for equality and for an effective presence in society by educating them about their legal rights.

Housing Facility (Hostel)

The hostel of GNG has got the status of government approved working women hostel. The college has two hostels within the campus with all modern amenities and accommodation for 150 students. Hostel has mess facility as well. Round the clock security service is also available. The hostel is an abode for students from J&K, UP, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh.

Hostel details and application forms are given in the Hostel prospectus.

Note : Hostel fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

Academic Guidance

Faculty members offer guidance to the students regarding choice of subjects from the courses available and even guide students for future job prospects of the chosen courses.

Counselling

The counselling center provides confidential counselling services to help the students adjust to the college and to assist them with the problems that can affect their well - being and academic success. Therefore, students are encouraged to seek counselling at first sight of difficulty, since early identification of problems minimize the impact of the problems.

Career Information and Guidance Bureau

Career Guidance Bureau has been established in the college for providing adequate information regarding career options. There is a special wing where students can read literature and periodicals on career guidance. Students can obtain latest information about the competitive examination and institutions of Higher Studies. The college also has tie ups with companies to update students with latest technologies.

Job Placements

Career Guidance Cell of the college encouraged students to attend On-Campus interviews not only for the ones held in the college campus but also for those held in various other institutions in Yamunanagar.

Library Rules

1. The college library remains open on all working days from 9.00 A.M. to 6.00 P.M.
2. The library is open to the college students, outsiders, staff and research scholars.
3. Umbrella, bag, personal books or belongings etc. are not allowed inside the Library. Personal belongings should be deposited at the Property Counter.
4. Students must carry Identity Cards with them whenever they enter the Library.
- 5.a) Text books are issued for the whole session to needy and deserving students. For that they will be required to apply with the prescribed form available at the issue counter. They are required to deposit library security which is 50% refundable in the month of April. **All the books must be returned within three days after annual examination, failing which a fine of Rs. 5/- per book per day will be charged.**
- b) Special amenity is given to the students during exam days. On depositing the book cost (refundable) they are allowed to get books issued till the examination. This is refundable in the month of August in the same year.
6. Students get library membership by depositing library security which is refundable in the month of April. Books will be issued on presentation of identity card. It is the responsibility of every reader to keep it in safe custody. Loss of I.D. card should be reported to the Librarian immediately.
7. Books will be issued for 28 days. A sum of Rs. 2/- per book per day will be charged for not returning the book within the specified time.
8. 'Reference' and 'Not to be issued' books shall not be lent out. Special request may be considered for overnight use only. The rate of overdue charge will be Rs. 10/- per day per volume.

- If any student takes admission to any class on false representation, holding back relevant facts or by supplying incorrect information, her admission would be cancelled and legal proceedings against her will be initiated.
- In the result column, (in Admission Form) the result status has to be clearly mentioned as whether Pass/ Fail/ Compartment.

Student Responsibilities

CODE OF CONDUCT

- ❖ Parents / Guardians are requested to read the Prospectus carefully and co-operate with the college authorities in counselling their wards to follow the rules and regulations.
- ❖ Various rules regarding college i.e. admission/dues/lectures/examination etc. are subject to change by the university/college and these changes shall be binding on all the students.
- ❖ Students should attend the classes regularly.
- ❖ Morning assembly is compulsory for all the students.
- ❖ Students should keep their Identity Card with them and must show to the college authorities on demand. A duplicate I-card can be issued from the college on payment of Rs. 50/-
- ❖ The students are requested to deposit college dues & full annual fee in the college office by due date. After the due date, they will be fined.
- ❖ **Parents are requested to see the subject teachers on the last Saturday of every month for the performance of their ward. The college shall not be responsible if a student is not allowed to appear in the examination in case she fails to fulfil the conditions as per K.U.K. rules.**
- ❖ To seek the blessings of Satguru, Sukhmani Sahib Path is held in the college before the commencement of every session and Akhand Path is held before the commencement of examination. It is compulsory for all the students to join these ceremonies. If a student does not attend these ceremonies or other important functions of the college, disciplinary action will be taken against her.
- ❖ Students must maintain discipline inside and outside the college.
- ❖ No student will be allowed to leave the college before 1:00 P.M.
- ❖ Political and non-academic meetings of any kind can not be held in the college premises without prior written permission of the Principal.
- ❖ Disturbing the classes and calling out any student from the class for any agitation is a serious offence.
- ❖ Damaging/Tampering with the college property is a matter of gross indiscipline. Serious action will be taken against the defaulter.
- ❖ Outsiders are not allowed in the college.
- ❖ Use of mobile phones is not allowed in classes. Defaulters shall be fined Rs. 500/-

Note :

1. Students seeking admission in the college must satisfy the eligibility conditions governed by the rules given in Kurukshetra University Calendar and ordinances mentioned in the college prospectus. In case of ineligibility of the admission, the students will solely be responsible for the consequences whatsoever.
2. **The admission will be treated cancelled due to non submission of original certificates and Migration certificate within fifteen days from the date of admission.**
3. The college reserves the right to refuse admission to any applicant without assigning any reason.
4. Merely depositing of fee does not ensure the right to admission.
5. Reservation policy will be adopted as per K.U.K. / Government rules.
6. The student shall not claim admission if she doesn't stand in the merit of admission list.
7. Fee paid is non-refundable.

Ragging

Ragging in an educational institution is banned and any one found indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately which may include expulsion, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology, with holding scholarship, results or other benefits, suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess. Format for Anti-Ragging Declaration is given with the prospectus. Students will submit the 'Declaration' duly signed by them and their parents at the time of admission.

The following will be termed as the act of ragging :

Any disorderly conduct whether verbal or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including rowdy or indisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
