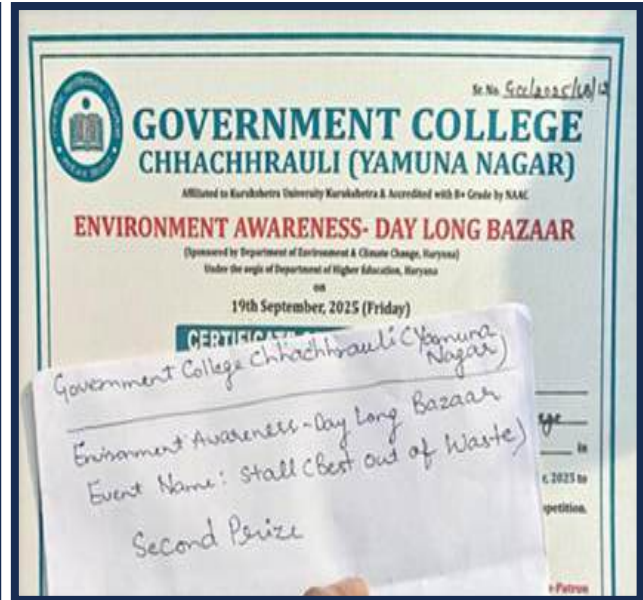
## **19<sup>th</sup> Sept 2026- My Plate My Health**

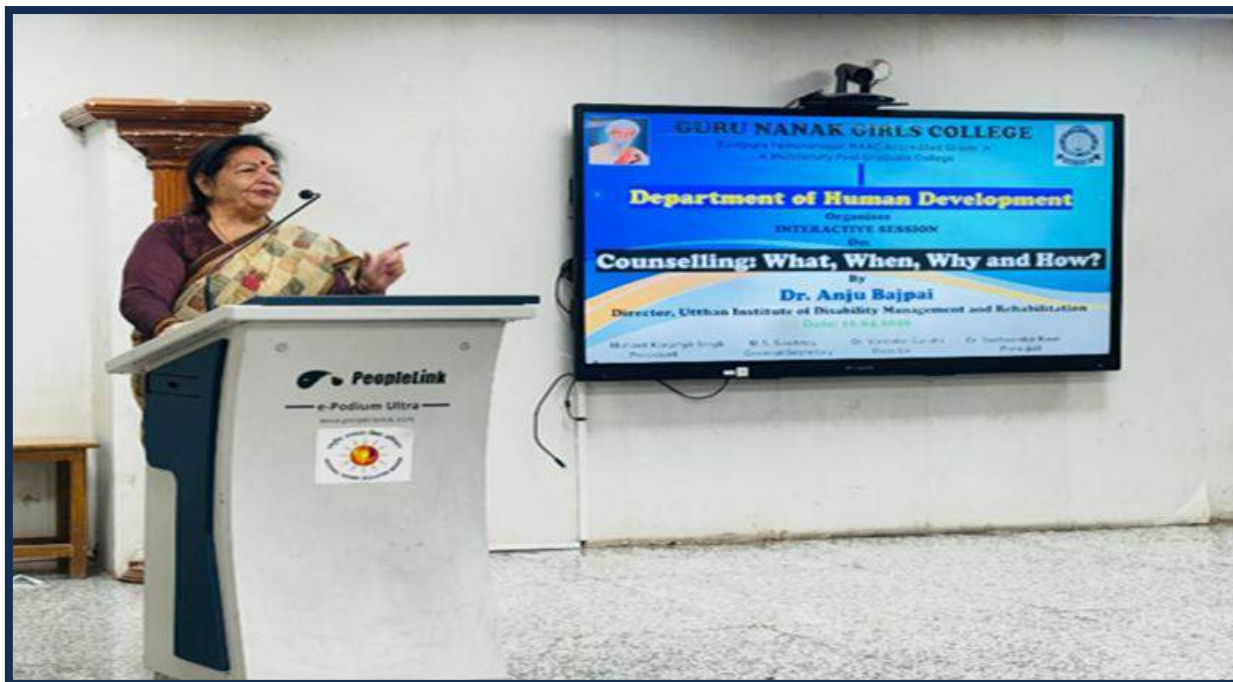
### **8<sup>th</sup> April 2026 – BMI Check-up Camp and Dietary Counselling**
